## Bible Study Series: "Not So With You" (lesson 6) Wealth (pt. 3) Tony Thornton, Minister July 22, 2020

Our quest continues to define and describe the distinctive characteristics of Christ-Followers. Christ-Followers have a "Kingdom" perspective with respect to Wealth/Material. To refresh our understanding of "Kingdom" perspective we first saw how Wealth/Material can corrupt.

Last week, we introduced an antidote to the corruption, seeing Wealth/Material as a grace or gift.

Today, we will discover how the "Open Hands" methodology we considered last week works within Scripture.

## Paul shows how the Macedonian Christ-Followers are a great example of \_\_\_\_\_\_(Receiving/Giving).

"In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. <sup>3</sup> For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, <sup>4</sup> they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people. <sup>5</sup> And they exceeded our expectations: They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us. <sup>6</sup> So we urged Titus, just as he had earlier made a beginning, to bring also to completion this act of grace on your part."
